MARKET SUMMARIES FOR JANUARY

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 748.5 million pounds of milk to the market during January. Daily deliveries averaged 24.1 million pounds, up 1.3 percent from December. An estimated 570 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 42,360 pounds, up 1.3 percent from December.

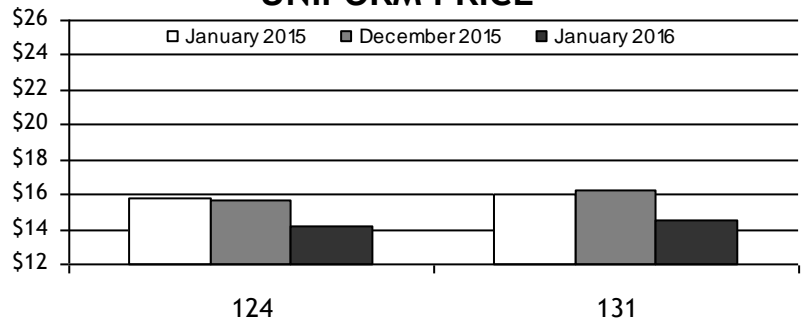
Class I producer milk during January totaled 165.0 million pounds, 22.1 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.3 million pounds, down 4.8 percent from December. ▼

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 432.4 million pounds of milk to the market during January. Daily deliveries averaged 13.9 million pounds, up 1.8 percent from December. An estimated 95 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 146,828 pounds, up 1.8 percent from December.

Class I producer milk during January totaled 107.7 million pounds, 24.9 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.5 million pounds, down 6.9 percent from December. ▼

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and a net decrease for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net increase of 1.89 cents between the January 16 and the February 13 surveys, to \$1.4958 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a net decrease of 3.58 cents to \$1.5074 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net increase of 10.94 cents between the weeks ending January 16 and February 13 from \$2.0420 per pound to \$2.1514 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net decrease of 1.88 cents since mid-January to \$0.7631 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net increase of 0.43 cents since mid-January to \$0.2375 per pound.

USDA Updates

USDA TO GATHER NEW DATA ON ORGANIC AGRICULTURE PRODUCTION

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) has begun conducting the 2015 Certified Organic Survey to gather up-to-date data on certified organic crops and livestock in the United States. This special survey effort is critical to help determine the economic impact of certified organic agriculture production in the United States.

NASS is mailing the survey to all known organic farms in the United States. The form asks farmers to provide information on acreage, production, and sales for a variety of certified organic crop and livestock commodities. In addition, NASS is gathering information about organic farmers' production and marketing practices. The agency urges all participants to respond by February 19. After this date, NASS will follow up by mail, phone and personal interviews with those who have not responded. Producers can return their forms by mail or complete the survey online at www.agcounts.usda.gov. ▼

USDA PUBLISHES PRESENTATION ON EXPANSION OF THE ORGANIC ASSESSMENT EXEMPTION

USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) has released a recorded presentation that provides an overview of modifications to the organic assessment exemption regulations under 23 Federal marketing orders and 22 research and promotion programs, collectively referred to as "commodity promotion programs."

The presentation provides an overview on how the amendments to the exemption will be applied to businesses under each of the commodity promotion programs moving forward. The recording can be accessed at www.ams.usda.gov/report-presentation/organic-exemption.

Changes to previous regulations expand the exemption to cover all "organic" and "100 percent organic" products certified under the National Organic Program regardless of whether the person requesting the exemption also produces, handles, markets, processes, manufactures, feeds, or imports conventional or nonorganic products. The revisions were authorized by the 2014 Farm Bill. AMS published a proposed rule with request for public comment in the December 14, 2014, *Federal Register* and issued the final rule on December 31, 2015. The expanded exemption takes effect on February 29, 2016.

AMS may conduct additional stakeholder information sessions as needed about the exemption. Contact information for specific AMS programs is available at the end of the presentation. Industry members wanting additional information can contact the board or committee that administers their industry's commodity promotion program. Industry boards and committees may direct questions to AMS personnel who oversee the respective program's activities. ▼
