MARKET SUMMARIES FOR JANUARY

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 742.3 million pounds of milk to the market during January. Daily deliveries averaged 23.9 million pounds, up 21.7 percent from December. An estimated 540 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 44,343 pounds, up 0.02 percent from December.

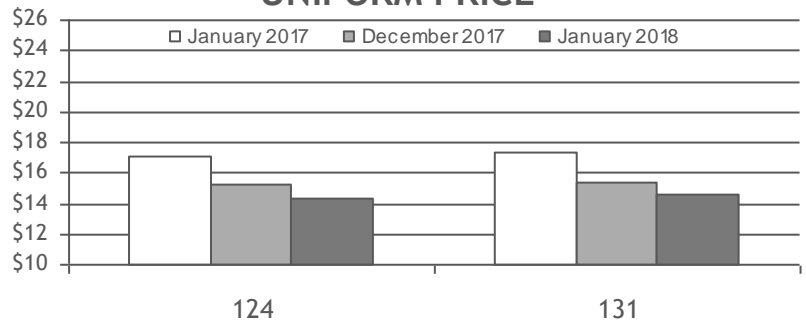
Class I producer milk during January totaled 163.1 million pounds, 22.0 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.3 million pounds, up 3.4 percent from December. ▼

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 481.9 million pounds of milk to the market during January. Daily deliveries averaged 15.5 million pounds, up 13.9 percent from December. An estimated 88 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 176,666 pounds, up 13.9 percent from December.

Class I producer milk during January totaled 115.3 million pounds, 23.9 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.7 million pounds, up 6.6 percent from December. ▼

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and a net decrease for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net increase of 0.52 cents between the January 13 and the February 17 surveys, to \$1.5273 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a net decrease of 10.88 cents to \$1.3874 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a decrease of 16.10 cents between the weeks ending January 13 and February 17 from \$2.2312 per pound to \$2.0702 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 2.14 cents since mid-January to \$0.7118 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net decrease of 3.09 cents since mid-January to \$0.2504 per pound.

DECISION ON PROPOSED CALIFORNIA FEDERAL MILK MARKETING ORDER DELAYED

On February 6, 2018, the Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) announced that it will be delaying its decision on the proposed California Federal Milk Marketing Order (FMMO). AMS intends to wait until the U.S. Supreme Court decides on a related legal matter.

On November 29, 2017, the Solicitor General of the United States submitted a brief to the U.S. Supreme Court in *Lucia v. Securities and Exchange Commission (Lucia)*. The Government's position is that an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) is an "inferior officer" of the United States, and should be subject to the Appointments Clause of Article II of the Constitution. At all times material to the hearing for the prospective promulgation of a FMMO for California, ALJ Jill S. Clifton presided over the proceedings on behalf of USDA. The Court is expected to hear oral arguments in *Lucia* during the current term and will make a decision on or before June 30, 2018. AMS has found it appropriate to delay further proceedings in the FMMO rulemaking until the Court renders its decision in *Lucia*.

On Tuesday, February 13, 2018, at 4:00 p.m Eastern (1:00 p.m. Pacific) USDA hosted a conference call for stakeholders with Stephen Vaden, Office of the General Counsel, to further explain the reasoning behind the delay. 🇺🇸

USDA HELPS DAIRY INDUSTRY REACH MORE DOMESTIC AND GLOBAL MARKETS

On February 14, the Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) made an announcement about its Animal Welfare Assessment Program (AWAP), which offers an independent assessment for industry animal welfare standards and programs. AWAP is a voluntary service for industry organizations that evaluates animal welfare standards for conformance with the International Organization for Standardization Technical Specification (TS) 34700. The AWAP offers organizations a way to reach new customers by meeting international standards.

AMS has determined that the National Dairy Farmers Assuring Responsible Management (FARM) Program meets the requirements of the TS 34700. "This is the first livestock animal care program approved by AMS under the assessment program which establishes a strong framework for industry animal welfare standards and programs to be verified that they are rooted in science and can be widely accepted," said Greg Ibach, Under Secretary for Marketing and Regulatory Programs.

The National Dairy FARM Program comprises dairy farmers, cooperatives, and processors across the United States. The National Milk Producers Federation, with support from Dairy Management Inc., created the National Dairy FARM Program to ensure that farmers demonstrate a commitment to quality farm management.
