## MARKET SUMMARIES FOR AUGUST

#### Pacific Northwest (FO 124)


Producers delivered a total of 784.4 million pounds of milk to the market during August. Daily deliveries averaged 25.3 million pounds, down 1.4 percent from July. An estimated 485 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 52,172 pounds, down 1.4 percent from July.

Class I producer milk during August totaled 140.2 million pounds, 17.9 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.5 million pounds, down 0.3 percent from July.

#### Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 384.3 million pounds of milk to the market during August. Daily deliveries averaged 12.4 million pounds, down 1.7 percent from July. An estimated 74 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 167,502 pounds, down 1.7 percent from July.

Class I producer milk during August totaled 107.1 million pounds, 27.9 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.5 million pounds, up 6.9 percent from July.

#### **CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES**

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed an increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and a net increase for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed an increase of 8.02 cents between the August 17 and the September 14 surveys, to \$1.9387 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed an increase of 0.08 cents to \$1.7530 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net decrease of 8.53 cents between the weeks ending August 17 and September 14 from \$2.3603 per pound to \$2.2750 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 0.56 cents since mid-August to \$1.0443 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net increase of 0.24 cents since mid-August to \$0.3700 per pound.

### **USDA News**

#### MILK DONATION REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

On September 16, 2019, USDA established the Milk Donation Reimbursement Program (MDRP). The program was authorized as part of the 2018 Farm Bill and is intended to encourage the donation of Grade A fluid milk products, provide nutrition assistance to individuals in low income groups, and reduce food waste.

The program will provide limited financial reimbursements for fluid milk production donations made by eligible dairy organizations who account to a Federal milk marketing order pool. The program requires a formalized partnership between eligible dairy organizations and eligible distributors.

Congress authorized \$9 million for Fiscal Year 2019 and \$5 million per fiscal year thereafter, for the life of the current Farm Bill. The deadline for submitting applications is November 6, 2019. Details about program eligibility and participation are available at www.ams.usda.gov/mdrp.

#### DAIRY BUSINESS INNOVATION INTIATIVES

USDA recently announced three grant recipients for the Dairy Business Innovation (DBI) Initiatives. The DBI Initiatives support dairy businesses in the development, production and marketing and distribution of dairy products.

DBI Initiatives will provide direct technical assistance and grants to dairy businesses, including niche dairy products, such as specialty cheese, or dairy products derived from the milk or a dairy animal. including cow, sheep and milk. These initiatives will specifically focus on: diversifying dairy product markets to reduce risk and develop higher-value uses for dairy products; Promoting business development that diversifies farmer income through processing and marketing innovation; and encouraging the use of regional milk production. The University of Tennessee, the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets, and the University of Wisconsin were all grant awardees. Throughout her time in the Dairy Program, Ms. Wyatt has held responsibilities for a variety of activities including accounting, audit, human resources, information technology, laboratory services, market information, office management, payroll and pool. Ms. Wyatt graduated from Ball State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Management.

Ms. Coale extended a special thank you to Alyce Owen, Assistant Market Administrator, Pacific Northwest and Arizona Federal milk marketing orders, who also has been serving in a rotational acting capacity as Market Administrator since Mr. Wise's retirement.
