MARKET SUMMARIES FOR OCTOBER

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)


Producers delivered a total of 634.4 million pounds of milk to the market during October. Daily deliveries averaged 20.5 million pounds, down 1.5 percent from September. An estimated 405 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 50,530 pounds, down 1.5 percent from September.

Class I producer milk during October totaled 154.0 million pounds, 24.3 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.0 million pounds, up 4.8 percent from September.

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 365.0 million pounds of milk to the market during October. Daily deliveries averaged 11.8 million pounds, up 5.4 percent from September. An estimated 74 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 159,114 pounds, up 5.4 percent from September.

Class I producer milk during October totaled 107.2 million pounds, 29.4 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.5 million pounds, up 1.8 percent from September.

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed an increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and an increase for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed an increase of 11.19 cents between the October 19 and the November 16 surveys, to \$2.1539 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed an increase of 44.55 cents to \$2.2913 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net decrease of 5.18 cents between the weeks ending October 19 and November 16 from \$2.1416 per pound to \$2.0898 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed an increase of 4.79 cents since mid-October to \$1.1549 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a decrease of 2.99 cents since mid-October to \$0.2992 per pound.

REINSTATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE ASSESSMENT

On November 19, 2019, the Market Administrator, Lisa K. Wyatt, sent a letter to all handlers in Federal Orders 124 and 131. The content of the letter states that the 3.5-cent per hundredweight administrative assessment that was waived for the milk pooled during the months of June through October 2019 will resume beginning with the milk pooled for the month of November 2019.

USDA EXTENDS APPLICATION DEADLINE FOR MILK DONATION REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

On November 6, 2019, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced an extension of the November 6, 2019, deadline to submit Milk Donation and Distribution Plans for Fiscal Year 2019 and Fiscal Year 2020. Applications are now due no later than December 6, 2019.

Interested partnerships must apply for Fiscal Year 2019 and Fiscal Year 2020 program participation by submitting a separate completed Milk Donation and Distribution Plan for each fiscal year by the extended deadline. Milk Donation and Distribution Plans submitted for Fiscal Year 2019 can reflect donations made from October 1, 2018, through September 30, 2019. After approval, partnerships will then be able to submit specific information to obtain retroactive reimbursement claims for Fiscal Year 2019. Plans for Fiscal Year 2019 and Fiscal Year 2020 will be approved by January 22, 2020.

Congress directed USDA to develop the program to reduce food waste and provide nutrition assistance to low-income individuals. Congress authorized \$9 million for the program in Fiscal Year 2019, and \$5 million per fiscal year thereafter. Under the program, eligible dairy organizations partner with non-profit organizations that distribute food to low income individuals. Those partnerships may apply for and receive limited reimbursements to cover expenses related to certain fluid milk product donations.
