MARKET SUMMARIES FOR JUNE

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 615.9 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 20.5 million pounds, up 0.5 percent from May. An estimated 445 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 46,133 pounds, up 0.5 percent from May.

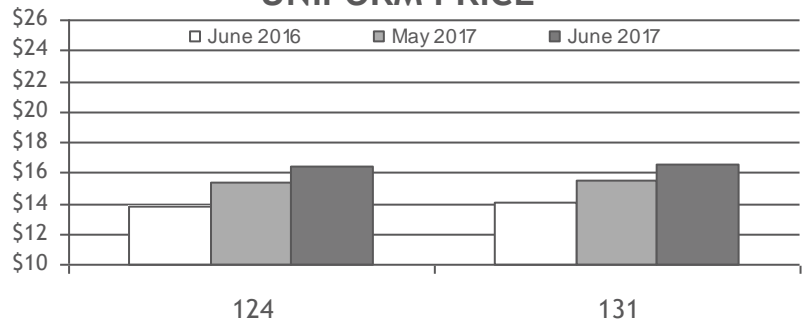
Class I producer milk during June totaled 151.9 million pounds, 24.7 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.1 million pounds, down 3.6 percent from May. ▼

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 433.0 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 14.4 million pounds, unchanged from May. An estimated 89 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 162,163 pounds, up slightly from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 101.7 million pounds, 23.5 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.4 million pounds, down 2.5 percent from May. ▼

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a decrease in prices received for 40-pound blocks and for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a decrease of 11.64 cents between the June 17 and the July 15 surveys, to \$1.5893 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a decrease of 10.49 cents to \$1.4178 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net increase of 15.47 cents between the weeks ending June 17 and July 15 from \$2.4539 per pound to \$2.6086 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net decrease of 1.70 cents since mid-June to \$0.9028 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a decrease of 4.53 cents since mid-June to \$0.4467 per pound.
