

MILK MARKET SUMMARIES FOR FEBRUARY 2001

James R. Daugherty, market administrator for the Pacific Northwest (FO 124), Western (FO 135), and Arizona-Las Vegas (FO 131) Federal milk orders, reports the following market information for the month of February 2001.

Pacific Northwest

Producers delivered a total of 498.9 million pounds of milk to the market during February. Daily deliveries averaged 17.8 million pounds, down 8.1 percent from January. An estimated 1,178 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 15,126 pounds, up 2.1 percent from January.

Class I producer milk during February totaled 159.1 million pounds, 31.9% of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.7 million pounds, down 6.1 percent from January.

Western

Producers delivered a total of 293.8 million pounds of milk to the market during February. Daily deliveries averaged 10.5 million pounds, down 0.7 percent from January. An estimated 770 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 13,627 pounds, down 0.7 percent from January.

Class I producer milk during February totaled 81.2 million pounds, 27.7% of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 2.9 million pounds, up 1.6 percent from January.

Arizona-Las Vegas

Producers delivered a total of 245.6 million pounds of milk to the market during February. Daily deliveries averaged 8.8 million pounds, up 2.9 percent from January. An estimated 120 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 73,083 pounds, up 2.9 percent from January.

Class I producer milk during February totaled 77.5 million pounds, 31.6% of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 2.8 million pounds, up 2.6 percent from January.
